SERVICE OF HOLY COMMUNION

Introductory sentence: "I shall give them singleness of heart and one way of life, so that they shall fear me at all times, for their own good and the good of their children after them." (Jeremiah 32 v38)

We have relaxed into a sense of easy complacency rather than follow the way of costly sacrifice. We have not shared your passion for peace and justice.

Silence

In his great mercy God forgives us; let us forgive one another; let us forgive ourselves.

The invitation is from Christ himself. The bread and wine we receive remind us he is here with us., renewing our lives. His invitation is to all who need his love or lack his joy.

Whoever we are, whatever we have done, share the broken bread, symbol of the love and forgiveness of God offered to us all in Jesus Christ. However much we believe, however much we doubt, share the poured out wine, the symbol of the life of Christ, reviving confidence and restoring hope. Come, receive, give thanks and be joyful.
